APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO ASSESS AS-IS ICT ENVI-RONMENT AND DE-VELOP A THREE YEAR-ICT STRATEGIC PLAN AND PER-FORM COBIT ASSESSMENT

1. PURPOSE

The Agency seeks the professional service of a well experienced Business acumen to assess the as-is ICT environment and develop a three-year ICT Strategic plan for implementation by the organization inclusive of the MSP, Structure assessment and alignment and COBIT assessment.

2. BACKGROUND

The Inkomati-Usuthu Catchment Management Agency (IUCMA) is a water resource management institution established under Section 78 of the National Water Act (Act 36 of 1998, NWA) having jurisdiction over the Inkomati-Usuthu Water Management Area (WMA). One of the inherent functions of a Catchment Management Agency (CMA) (s80) NWA it to investigate and advise interested persons on water resource protection, use, conservation, and management.

The Agency has a staff complement of 115 with five (5) departments with their associated division ranging at approximately nineteen (19).

Its four programmes namely Administration and Governance, Water Resources Management, Corporate Services and Finance. Within the Core Function there are six divisions, five in corporate services and three in finance. There is also the Governance Division headed by the Board Secretary to support the Governing Board with legal services and committee work while the CEO office has internal audit, monitoring and evaluation, and Strategic support.

The Information Technology unit reports to the Executive: Corporate Services.

3. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aim and objectives of this TOR document is to solicit quotations/proposals from professional ICT Governance professional service providers in the Republic of South Africa to assess the asis ICT governance status and develop a three-year Strategy inclusive of Master System Plan, ICT structure alignment, COBIT assessment. The strategy should focus on the identification of, and mitigation of risks related to latest technological trends, market analysis, swot analysis,

minimized ICT risks, enhanced operational efficiency, cost implications, and recommend accordingly. That the proposed strategy meets the legislative requirements and compliance with ICT industry generally acceptable practices followed by recommendations to ensure compliance with legislation and ICT industry generally acceptable standards.

4. SCOPE OF WORK/ DELIVERABLES

- 4.1 The scope is to assess as-is ICT environment to develop as strategy inclusive of:
 - MSP.
 - Structure alignment.
 - COBIT assessment and implementation plan.

5. Project Period

7. EVALUATION PROCESS

The bid will be evaluated and adjudicated on three (3) different phases as follows:

- i. Phase 1: Mandatory Requirements
- ii. Phase 2: Functionality requirements
- iii. Phase 3: Price and BBBEE evaluation

Phase 1: Compliance/ mandatory Requirements

All bids will be examined to determine compliance with bidding requirements and conditions. The proposals will be verified against all administrative requirements of the bid which include the completeness of the Standard Bidding Documents. Bidders who do not fulfil all the requirements or do not submit the required documents will be disqualified and not be evaluated further on compulsory requirements. The compliance requirements include the following:

- There will be compulsory virtual briefing session online.
- Registration on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD).
- Standard bidding documents must be fully completed and signed, where the answer is not applicable, it must be indicated with N/A, failure to complete will result in disqualification.

- Standard bidding Documents 1, 4, 6.1, 8 and 9.
- Bid documents must be fully completed, where the answer is not applicable, it must be indicated with N/A, failure to complete will result in disqualification.
- The BID document must NOT be altered, only hand-written formal written quotations will be accepted.

Phase 2: Functionality Requirements

The evaluation of bidders of functionality will be done in terms of the evaluation criteria as indicated in Table 1 below. Only bids that meet the minimum threshold of **70 out of 100 points** for functionality will proceed to the next stage. The evaluation of functionality will be evaluated in accordance with the functionality criteria below and applicable values.
